ALPHA HOUSE of Tampa

2016 Client Data:

- 26% White
- 74% African-American
(11% of the total identifies as Hispanic)
- Average age: 26
- Total families served:**
105 mothers and 119 babies and toddlers
- 100% were experiencing homelessness or living in unsafe conditions
- 51% had a history of domestic violence, sexual violence and/or trauma
- 37% of residents 18 and over had not graduated high school or received their GED prior to admission



Sally (not her real name) experienced domestic violence at the hands of her former boyfriend. Terrified for her life at his pending release from incarceration, she moved her family to the Tampa Bay area where she found shelter at Alpha House of Tampa.

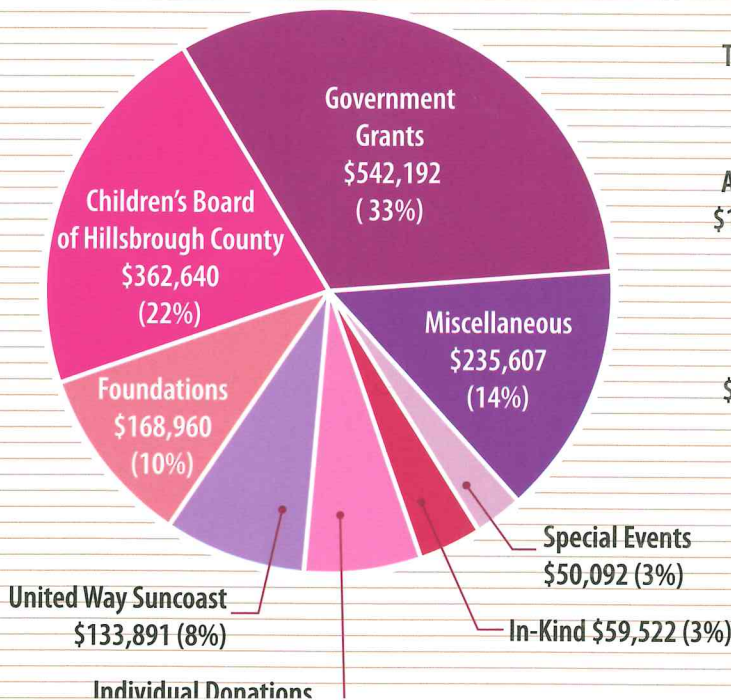
This is Sally's story:

Alpha House offered me emotional support, one-on-one sessions with staff, and referrals to a specialist. I was provided resources ... food, computer access, counseling on money management, parenting classes, and housing search services. With the support of my case manager, I enrolled in college to pursue a Bachelor's degree. Eventually I transitioned into my own apartment; there, my children and I have our own beds and a kitchen table. Even after leaving the program, staff continues to check in with us to make sure that we are doing OK. If anyone wants to know what Alpha House means to me, I would tell them that I have regained my composure, my mind has been strengthened, and I have taken my life back.

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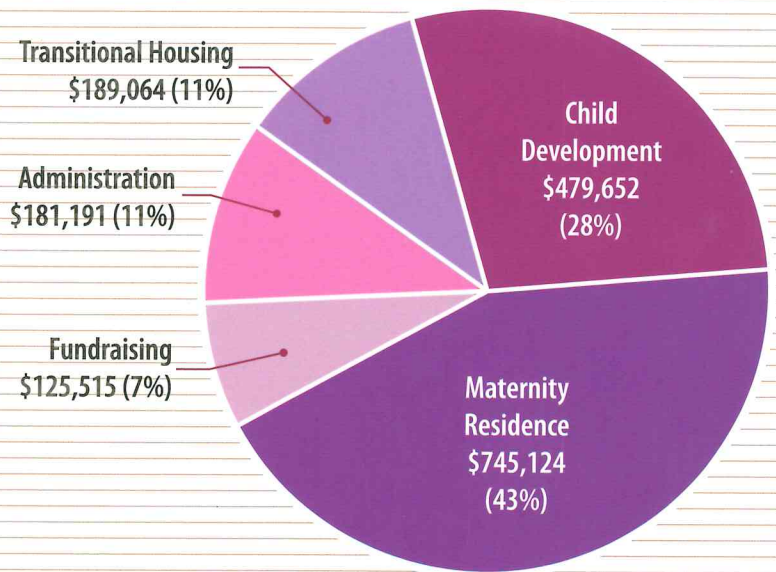
Revenue 2016
